  - *We are interested in what your organization learned and how you will apply what was learned moving forward. Effective organizations (nonprofit organizations and funders alike!) are constantly re-evaluating and tweaking efforts for continuous improvement.*
- Describe any additional funding secured, collaborations created, or partnerships developed since the BBF grant was awarded.
  - *We are interested in how your organization has leveraged additional support for the effort supported by BBF.*
